Comment: I object to the planning application based on the following

- 1. Safety of pedestrians
- 2. Current lorry restrictions on Common Lane
- 3.Blind corner at junction of Common Lane and Broad Lane and safety concerns
- 4. Ground water aquifer pollution
- 5.Air pollution
- 6. Noise Pollution.
- 1. Broad lane is only partially paved and the road is narrow especially when residents park their cars. Large lorries passing down this lane pose a danger to pedestrians especially children who use this road daily during school term times. The lane is also very congested during several hours of the day due to school traffic and additional large construction lorries will make the situation even worse.
- 2. Common lane has a lorry restriction already in place which is not policed and lorries illegally use the lane without recourse. The proposed development will exacerbate the current situation.
- 3. There is a blind corner at the junction of Common Lane and Broad Lane the corner is also constricted in many other ways and having large lorries using this junction poses additional safety concerns. Hook Green lane is the only alternative access to these proposed premises and this lane I believe currently restricts wide vehicles. At any rate it is not suitable for large lorries carrying industrial equipment.
- 4. I understand the site is above a ground water aquifer and as such I am concerned about the possibility of pollution from this proposed industrial site.
- 5. There is a risk additional traffic, cars and lorries will increase air pollution in a residential area and close by a number of schools both primary and secondary.

6. Additional traffic due to the transportation, and maintenance of of the machinery stored in the proposed development will contribute to noise pollution in this residential area.
I strongly oppose this planning application for the above reasons.
