Comment:- The development is neither positive nor consistent with the sustaining desirability or the sympathetic requirements for a positive contribution to the Conservation Area (CA). The proposed scale, height and orientation will harm the settings of these heritage assets. Intervisibility exists and would be worsened.

- The proposal does not have sufficient significance to merit a positive planning decision in a significant historic environment. The proposed design is poor / of low quality and will blight views

from listed buildings in the CA.

- The development and recreational disturbance (light and noise) will harm local wildlife. No SANG survey undertaken (note bats, insects, amphibians, hedgehogs).
- The current temporary designed structures cannot create a precedence for an permanent establishment.
- The site has been confirmed as a commercial area (capable of providing employment). Testing required to assess continued viability.
- Note the historic easement to be blighted.
