- e.g. Oak (T3) fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

A Dying Holly Bush was located on the border of 1-24 Oaklands Court and the Hempstead Road. The bush provided an attractive visual and sound barrier to the Hempstead road. As the bush was dying and falling over we wanted to replace it with another Holly Bush. Unfortunately we were not aware there was a group TPO that applies to all the fauna in that location. (Area 1 , TPO3). Stephanie Waldren Planning Enforcement Officer has been involved and informed by the contactor that the Holly tree which has been removed was dying and falling to one side. She advised us that as the work has already been carried out we would need to submit a retrospective application.

The plan is to replace the Holly that has been removed and plant further plants in the gaps along the border. 6 Red Robins have recently been planted in the SW corner however they take between 5-7 years to fully mature so we would like to add a mix of more mature evergreen shrubs adjacent to the Hempstead Road and the Red Robins along the border facing the 1-12 Block. We are also open to alternative proposals. The intention is to enhance the amenity and not remove the plants.
