

Main Lawn

The pool is built into the bank to hide it from view. Terraced beds and steps lead to the lower pool level. Side retaining walls screen the pool and terrace at the lower level. Refer to DWG HP139/110 for additional details.

Near the pool the banks have been regraded to tie in with the pool. At the boundary and before the tree root zones they will tie in with existing levels to avoid any disturbances to ground levels in these areas.

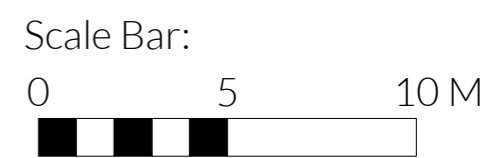
A path to an existing field gate at the boundary will be mown to link views to the countryside beyond.

Fruit trees will be planted through the meadow on a broken grid to evoke the feeling of an ancient orchard. Trees grown on M26 rootstock will be selected to reduce their eventual height.



A wildflower meadow will be established in the lower area of the garden with a small, informal lawn adjacent to the pool.

The southern boundary planting will be extended and added to creating a softer transition at the end of the garden.
