This work was completed but at the time, we didn't raise the crown to the front (around the light) and left hand side (over neighbours driveway) as at the time the work wasn't required. These have grown considerably over the past couple of years so I feel it makes sense for the appearance of the tree to raise the crown at the front and left to 5.0m which will involve removing the branches around the light and those over hanging my neighbours driveway. This will balance the tree.
