1. The first species is unknown.

2. Hawthorne

We bought this house in October 2019. At the bottom of our garden a large tree from our next door neighbour's garden (of unknown species) collapsed on our land. This happened many years ago.

In that time it became entangled in our large hawthorn tree and grew vertically across the back of our garden on top of a large mound of rubbish left there by the developer of the houses in the 1960s. This mound has been added to over the subsequent decades with both trees growing over it. The land measures a large area of 8m x 5m.

We cannot remove this mound of earth, metal and concrete without felling the unknown tree (which is now dead) and at least lopping the hawthorn, although we would like to fell the hawthorn. We have permission from our neighbour to fell their tree. We know it is our responsibility.

We are seeking to fell both trees but the house is in a conservation area and we need your permission to do that.

At the moment we cannot use a large part of our garden. The previous owner did not have an issue with this as she was a single elderly lady. We are a family. Many thanks.
