We do not believe any of the six trees planted by my father-in-law in approximately 1985 are subject to a preservation order.

- Tree 1 Silver Birch is very close to our driveway and neighbours garage and this has previously caused concern to them.
- Trees 2 and 3 Leylandii Both are very close to border fence and outbuilding.
- Tree 4 Plumtree The tree trunk is damaged and needs to be replaced with another Plumtree.

Tree 5 - Unknown species of evergreen which produces red berries. This has been planted too close to an original feature wall and the house and blocks out considerable light.

Tree 6 - Silver Birch - This has been planted too close to two original feature walls.

We intend to relay and replant smaller, manageable trees and shrubs to replace those taken out.
