Further to your notification received on 26th January 2021, I am able to confirm that the trees are of a condition to fulfil the description of being dangerous for the purposes of Regulation 14 (1) (c) of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation) (England) Regulations 2012. This exemption allows you to carry out such works as are urgently necessary to remove an immediate risk of serious harm without further notification to, or consent from, this authority.

The legislation places a duty upon landowners to plant replacement trees for those removed under this exemption. However, I can confirm that on this occasion the Local Planning Authority does not require replacement trees to be planted.
