Hello,

I have spoken to our tree surgeon about this and we would like to clarify the specification:

Reduce height and spread of crown by 30% - remove approximately 3-4m all the way around the crown.

It doesn't look like the tree has ever been reduced so it is a very large tree that overhangs the gardens and blocks light to the houses. Our client is keen to cut it back as much as possible but we have recommended 30% rather than pollarding or anything more major. The reduction is to allow more light through and to keep it at a more appropriate size
