The garages are located to the rear of an existing flat block and do not have any specific architectural quality. It is also noted that the surrounding area is comprised primarily of similar garages. Given the above the principle of constructing replacement garages is considered acceptable in principle, subject to achieving a suitable design quality. The proposed design is considered to be simple and relatively limited. Having regards to the practical function of the development, the surrounding character of the area and the existing garages on site, the proposal would be considered to have a neutral impact upon the character and appearance of the Conservation Area and is therefore acceptable in its design.
