Subject: Leylandii Hedge Removal Permission

Dear Sir or Madam,

I would like to remove a tall Leylandii hedge on the boundary between The Mead House and Pound Tree Cottage, Ampney Crucis, Cirencester, GL7 5RY.

Both Mrs B Tompson the owner of The Mead House and Mr & Mrs J Evans the owners of Pound Cottage are in agreement that the hedge should be removed, as it restricts light access into both properties, plus its roots have brought down a section of the Cotswold stone wall to the Mead House.

Reading through the government guidelines on what permission is required to carryout the removal of hedges, it doesn't say I require a section 211 notice before undertaking the removal? However after talking to a member of our parish council and with the Mead House being in a village conservation area, they thought it best to ask you first for clarification.

I have attached a PDF file which contains an aerial google map view of the location of the hedge marked in blue, plus two pictures of the hedge for you to view.

Also the dimension of the hedge in question are: 11.50m Long, 3.40m Tall & 2m Wide. Its has also started to die due to a bad attack of Cypress aphid damaged.

Hopefully this is all the information you require to give me an answer on if I need permission from you to carryout this work?
