Large beech tree approx. 200 year old situated in No. 3 Staunton House. Subject to TPO 192 issued May 2013.

Substantial old beech tree that provides local 'Amenity value' but requires pruning to avoid further damage to the tree and neighbouring properties.

We have recently removed as much of the dead wood from the tree as we could and whilst the tree surgeon was in the tree he also observed that two branches on the north side are rubbing and crossover causing damage to the tree. He advised that this should be dealt with when permission is granted for pruning the crown.

We request permission to remove two lower branches that were previously pruned and are now decaying causing concern for their safety. The depth of decay

is unknown at this time.

Image 2 Black arrow - "There is a risk that this branch will die due to previous pruning" as per attached tree report. This also has wound decay from previous pruning.

Whilst we appreciate the 'amenity value' of this tree we are keen to preserve its value but also remove the concern over branch failure. To maintain a balanced tree we propose a general thinning of the crown by approx. 25%.
