e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Oak (T1), Beech (T2), Beech (T3), Holly (T4) are all in the rear garden and require crown lifting
T1-T3 have low hanging branches, some of which have already fallen away. (pictures attached).
T1-T2 are towards the rear of the garden on on a barked area, which we have chosen for a children's play area and we would like to reduce/remove the low hanging branches to ensure safeguard the play area for the children and remove the possibility of some of the branches falling and injuring them
T1 - crown lifting - by 1m, (4 lower hanging branches) - approx 10% of tree, leaving a clearance from ground of approx 5m
T2 - crown lifting - by 1m, (3 lower hanging branches) - approx 10% of tree, leaving a clearance from ground of approx 5m
T3 - crown lifting - by 2m - (5 lower hanging branches) - approx 20% of the tree - leaving a clearance from ground of approx 5m
T4 - crown lifting - by 1m - approx 20% of tree, leaving a clearance from ground of approx 2.5m
T4 - requires crown lifting and has holly that is reaching the ground, also in the purposed play area, and we would simply raise up the lower branches so children will not get stung/injured from it, whilst still maintaining 2/3rds of the holly tree. -
Beech (T5) - requires crown reduction - reducing by 30% - approx 3m branches reduced to 1m (on just one side that is hanging over the roof). The final spread of the tree would be 8m, whereas at the moment it is approx 10m - It has some branches that have already fallen away. Some branches are hanging perilously close to the roof of our property. We would like to raise up the lower branches to remove them away from our roof and thereby eliminate the possibility of a infestation in our attic from squirrels also.
Beech (T6) - requires crown lifting - by 2m - 20% of the tree - leaving a clearance above ground of 4m . Again some of the lower branches have already fallen away and we would propose to remove the lower branches to safeguard injury to our children.
