Walnut Tree. Fully Grown. Complete Removal.

The Bark on the south face has totally peeled off to a height of 1.8m, and this winter has begun a secondary peeling to a deeper level. The production of leaves and walnuts has significantly declined in the 6 years we have lived at the Boat House - the leaves don't open until late May and are dropping in July. There are numerous dead branches amongst the canopy. Removing most of a dead-looking branch (to the right/east side) did result in some rejuvenation. (That was done for safety reasons as the far end was most definitely dead and overhanging the neighbouring garden with small children passing under it.) But with the increased deterioration of the bark, and the significant decrease in leaf quality, I feel this tree needs removing and replacing. I would replace it with

another walnut, but think it might be wrong to replace like for like immediately, so would like to try a Linden/Lime/Tilia Tomentosa.
