All surfaces to be cleaned with anti bacterial spray before every service.

On site toilet to be cleaned every 20 minutes whilst the event is live.

All kitchen and bar surfaces to be cleaned continually every 20 minutes whilst event is live.

Any signs that can be touched by staff and customers also to be cleaned before and after every service.

### **Social Distancing**

Social Distancing -Reducing the number of persons in any work area to comply with the 1.5 metre (5 foot) gap recommended by the Public Health Agency

Cleaning checklist in place for the greenhouses to make sure nothing is missed.

An updated and rigorous cleaning regime for both kitchen and bar.

Staff to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it.

Management checks to ensure this is adhered to.

Onsite one way system in place to avoid any 'bottle necking' or passing of staff and guests. Redesigning processes to ensure social distancing in place. Signs reminding people of the 2 metre gap to be on display. All guests to be sat within their own dining space Conference calls to be used instead of for the duration of their experience unless face to face meetings. leaving to use the toilet. Ensuring sufficient rest breaks for staff. Guests to arrive with in a 2 hour window of time Social distancing also to be adhered to to avoid al guests arriving at the same time. in smoking area. Only 1 member of staff to be using the bar at one time. Only 2 staff to operate within the kitchen as to allow a working environment whilst adhering to **Wearing of Gloves** Where Risk Assessment identifies a social distance. wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves Staff to be reminded that wearing of gloves is not a substitute for good hand washing. carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. All staff will be issued PPE; face masks, gloves and an apron. Whilst cooking, making drinks and serving customers, masks will be worn at all times. Reminders of wearing PPE signage during service will be placed around the serving areas and back of house.

## A PPE check that everyone has correct items and spares will be carried out before service. **Symptoms of Covid-19** If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature in the workplace they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance.
