

# **Health Impact Assessment**

Demolition of no's 17 and 17b Between Towns Road and Cowley Conservative Club, Between Towns Road

Erection of building of three, four and five storey building incorporating 206 student study rooms (including 7 DDA compliant rooms and 11 studios), indoor and outdoor communal space, bin and bicycle storage and landscaping

Paragraph 91 of the NPPF seeks to ensure that planning policies and decisions should achieve healthy, safe and inclusive places which promote social interaction, which are safe and accessible and which enable and support healthy lifestyles.

To provide the social, recreational and cultural facilities and services the community needs, policies and decisions should plan positively for the provision of shared space to enhance the sustainability of communities and residential environments, guarding against the unnecessary loss of valued facilities and services, particularly where this reduces the community's ability to meet its day-to-day needs (Paragraph 92, NPPF). As explained in the accompanying planning statement, the loss of the existing Conservative Club is not considered to amount to the loss of a valued facility – it existed for the benefit of its members only and there are a wide range of alternative facilities in Cowley to meet the needs of the local community. To this existing range should be added the provision of new ground floor space within this development, which is to be accessible by the local community.

Policy RE5 of the Council's adopted Local Plan requires all major development proposals to be accompanied by a Health Impact Assessment which monitors how a proposal will deliver the aims of reducing health inequalities.

The accompanying guidance (Appendix 4 of the Local Plan) sets out that only a basic HIA is likely to be required for non-strategic applications and on this basis we have used the "Rapid" HIA template, as prepared by the London Healthy Urban Design Unit.
