

Dear Ms Dodds,

I'm writing in relation to the proposed 5G telecommunications installation on the corner of Quarry Road, opposite Margaret Road, consultation

I feel very strongly that this is a proposal which should not be followed through. Although developers of this technology are keen to assure us that it will be safe, the fact is that there has simply not been enough research to state this with any certainty. Green MEPs have been calling for such research for some time. Disquiet about unresearched risks has halted the arrival of 5G in Brussels and elsewhere. Undoubtedly there are significant numbers of scientists who are concerned about health risks, notably cancer

The WHO has stated that it presents the same degree of risk as red meat. Since the NHS nowadays urges us to cut red meat down to a minimum on the grounds of its cancer risk, the parallel is hardly reassuring; no one who lives in the vicinity of this technology can choose to cut down their radiation intake to one 'helping' a week.

I am concerned for myself and my family, as well as others in the local environment. Within a street of the proposed tower there are at least two nurseries, a school, houses and two much-used parks. Communities should not find themselves as health guineapigs for the sake of technology rushed forward ahead of sufficient research for the sake of economic progress. We also need to consider the potential impact on the natural environment around us, not to mention the broader ever increasing drain on our environment's resources that is made by our society's constant 'need' for more.

Health is my primary concern here, though no doubt the tower will also devalue the houses around it and become an eyesore, towering over the trees in this conservation area. While we lack the research to lay health concerns to rest, I strongly urge that the installation be halted. Community consultation ends this Friday; I would much appreciate your support on this matter.
