## Flooring Type:

1. wooden floor at entrance behind entrance doors - All hardwood flooring there or engineered flooring. Engineered flooring would be sympathetic to the historic requirements of the building and would provide longevity and ease of procurement..

The "reception" area does not have a great amount of natural light to it. Any natural light will be 'borrowed' passing through each office suite and into the corridors via the glass blocks used on the office suites corridor walls. A light colour is to be used, it would help reflect the light around and create a feeling of space as you walked into this area.





"Reception Area"

Glass brick used in feature brick wall to reception. Bricks would be seen to be illuminated in reception from the light in the office suite behind the feature brick wall.



The glass blocks as shown on the corridor pictures are a standard type of product The purpose in using them is to allow natural light to pass into the corridors and through into the centrally located offices. The central offices do not have any external walls so would rely entirely on borrowed light. Clearly, there will be electric lighting, but natural light makes for a more attractive workplace.

There are various types of glass block available from fully transparent and opaque finishes. Glass block is a hard wearing material, and is very resistant to impact damage.




Example: Standard glass block with satin finish on both sides. Satin finish as a wall installation



Example: Standard glass block with frosted finish.

Both offer privacy, the satin finish block offering a higher level of privacy than the frosted block. Frosted finish will allow a higher level of light transmission through the material, which would make for a brighter corridor area.



Heckmondwike produce a range of commercial carpeting and are a well known manufacturer. Their SupaCord range is a hardwearing product, is readily available and comes in a wide range of colours. It is used in schools and offices which are both high traffic areas. Supacord comes as both a roll or as tiles. Tiles have the advantage of being removable, so tiles in areas of high traffic can be swapped around with tiles from areas of low or no traffic, thus prolonging their life.

## 3. Toilets: Non-Slip Vinyl Flooring

It would be recommended to lay an anti-slip, waterproof flooring to the toilets area. Thus protecting the buildings original floor. Polyflor is hardwearing, readily available and comes in a vast array of colours and finishes.

Polyflor comes in sheet form and is bonded to the floor substrate. An advantage of this type of flooring is the ability to create an upstand, so instead of having a skirting board, you have a continuous and sealed waterproof vinyl upstand instead of a traditional skirting. This provides a tank system should an accidental leak from the toilets/sinks occur.



# 4. Indicative images of proposed Kitchen fit-out
















The above is a Howden's standard kitchen range, with gloss, handleless slab front doors. This is to be teamed with industrial style energy efficient LED lighting, to give a modern, but vintage feel that is in keeping with the historic nature of the building.







The kitchen benching to be bespoke manufactured from sanded scaffold planks and use a Key-Klamp framing arrangement for support. This will complement the industrial feel of the office space.

#### **Internal Doors**
