

species using the barn, the number of bats and the types of roost present. It is highly likely that a mitigation licence will then need to be sought from Natural England prior to any conversion work to Barn A, to remain legally compliant. Until a licence is granted, no works to the roof or internal repointing etc within Barn A should be undertaken, to avoid any breach of legislation.

A minimum of one evening emergence survey is required on Barn B during the active season for bats (May-September), to ascertain the presence/absence of roosting bats. If the presence of bats within Barn B is confirmed during this survey, then further work will be required.

Following the further survey work, advice can be provided to ensure legal compliance during the proposed works.

5.3 Birds

5.3.1 Legal protection

All common wild birds are protected under The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (and as amended). Under this legislation it is an offence to:

- Kill, injure or take any wild bird
- Take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird while it is in use or being built
- Take or destroy the egg of any wild bird

Certain rare breeding birds are listed on Schedule 1 of The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (and as amended). Under this legislation they are afforded the same protection as common wild birds and are also protected against disturbance whilst building a nest or on or near a nest containing eggs/unfledged young.

5.3.2 Recommendations for common bird species

Any conversion works should commence outside of the active nesting season which typically runs from early March through to early September. If work starts during the bird breeding season, a search for nests should be carried out beforehand, and active nests should be protected until the young fledge.

5.4 Recommendations for ecological enhancement

In addition to the legislation which is in place to safeguard protected species, there is also legislation and policy which imposes duties to undertake action to prevent loss of biodiversity and species/habitats of principle importance in the UK. In England and Wales, the Natural Environment and Rural Communities (NERC) Act 2006, imposes a duty on all public bodies (including Local Authorities and statutory bodies) to conserve biodiversity – including restoring

and enhancing a population or habitat. In addition, government planning policy guidance throughout the UK, provided in the latest National Planning Policy Framework (February 2019), states that '... local planning authorities should apply the following principles'; 'if significant harm to biodiversity resulting from a development cannot be avoided (through locating on an alternative site with less harmful impacts), adequately mitigated, or, as a last resort, compensated for, then planning permission should be refused'.

In order to try and secure biodiversity net gain on site and fulfil the Local Planning Authority's obligations under the NERC Act 2006, the following outline measures are recommended.

- Replacement nest sites for swallows must be considered prior to the conversion of Barn B, as these birds are very faithful to their nest sites. The simplest option is to allow them access into a suitable outbuilding or garage adjacent to the site (bearing in mind the number of droppings produced can be significant). If this is not possible, then a simple lean-to structure built onto an existing building on site will suffice. Nesting ledges should be provided within the lean-to, or nest cups can be installed, such as the No. 10 Schwegler swallow nest. These should be located at height to avoid the risk of predation by cats.
- 2 x integral or external sparrow terrace nest boxes must be installed within/on the new holiday lets for use by house sparrow *Passer domesticus*, which are declining in the UK. Nesting features should be installed on the northern or eastern elevations at eaves level. Details of nest boxes suitable for use by a range of common bird species can be obtained from www.nhbs.co.uk or www.wildcareshop.co.uk.

6 SUMMARY

Two barns at Manor Farm, Little Carlton in Lincolnshire were surveyed in connection with proposals to convert the barns into holiday lets.

Further survey work is required between May and September in respect of bats, and a mitigation licence is likely to be required from Natural England before any works can be undertaken on Barn A.

Vigilance and best practise are required in respect of badgers and ground mammals, and appropriate timings in respect of nesting birds.

Ecological enhancements are recommended in order to ensure no net loss to biodiversity and

to try and secure a net gain of biodiversity on site. These are as follows:

- Provision of replacement swallow nest sites and installation of sparrow boxes

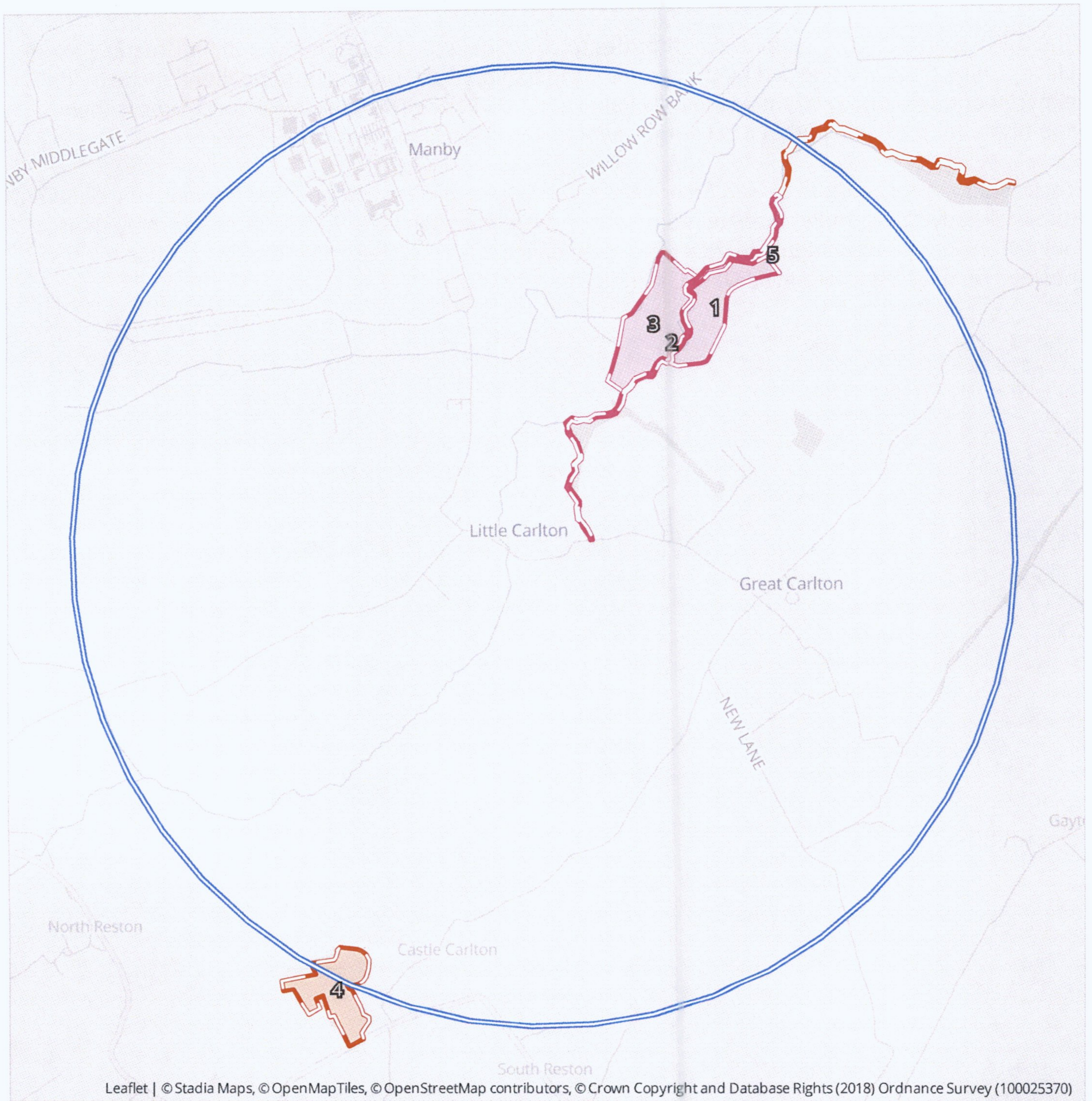
Non-statutory sites
