Babergh District Council as Local Planning Authority, hereby give notice that <u>PLANNING</u> <u>PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED</u> in accordance with the application particulars and plans listed in section A subject to the following conditions:

1. ACTION REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SPECIFIC TIMETABLE: COMMENCEMENT TIME LIMIT

The development hereby permitted shall be begun not later than the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

Reason - To comply with the requirements of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended by Section 51 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004

APPROVED PLANS & DOCUMENTS

The development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with the drawings/documents listed under Section A above and/or such other drawings/documents as may be approved by the Local Planning Authority in writing pursuant to other conditions of this permission or such drawings/documents as may subsequently be approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority as a non-material amendment following an application in that regard. Such development hereby permitted shall be carried out in accordance with any Phasing Plan approved under Section A, or as necessary in accordance with any successive Phasing Plan as may subsequently be approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority prior to the commencement of development pursuant to this condition.

Reason - For the avoidance of doubt and in the interests of proper phased planning of the development.

3. ACTION REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SPECIFIC TIMETABLE: DETAILS OF BRICKS

Prior to the commencement of any works above slab level, manufacturer's details of the proposed facing bricks for the walls shall be submitted to and approved, in writing, by the Local Planning Authority and shall be implemented and completed as approved.

Reason - In the interests of the character, integrity and preservation of the building

4. ACTION REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SPECIFIC TIMETABLE: LIGHTING

Prior to the erection/installation of any means of external lighting at the site, a scheme of lighting to include details of the position, height, aiming points, lighting levels and a polar luminance diagram based on the vertical plane, showing isolux contour lines at 2, 1 and 0 lux shall be submitted to and approved, in writing, by the Local Planning Authority. The

lighting shall be carried out and retained as may be approved. There shall be no other means of external lighting installed and/or operated on/at the site.

Reason - In the interests of amenity to reduce the impact of night time illumination on the character of the area and in the interests of biodiversity.

5. ACTION REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SPECIFIC TIMETABLE: AIR SOURCE HEAT PUMPS

Prior to the erection/installation of any Air Source Heat Pumps at the site, a manufacturer's acoustic details, as well as details of the location and orientation of the Air Source Heat Pump units shall be submitted to and approved, in writing, by the Local Planning Authority. The Air Source Heat Pump shall thereafter be implemented and retained as may be approved.

Reason - In the interest of the amenity of neighbouring residents having regard to the background noise levels in the area.

6. ACTION REQUIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SPECIFIC TIMETABLE AND ON GOING REQUIREMENT OF DEVELOPMENT: HIGHWAYS - ACCESS

The access shall be completed in all respects in accordance with Drawing No. 5161-0110 P04 with an entrance width of 4.5m and be available for use before occupation. Thereafter it shall be retained in its approved form. At this time all other means of access within the frontage of the application site shall be permanently and effectively "stopped up" in a manner which previously shall have been approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: In the interests of highway safety to ensure the approved layout is properly constructed and laid out and to avoid multiple accesses which would be detrimental to highway safety.

ACTION REQUIRED PRIOR TO FIRST USE: HIGHWAYS - VISIBILITY

Before the access is first used, visibility splays shall be provided in accordance with details previously approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority and thereafter shall be retained in the approved form. Notwithstanding the provisions of Part 2 Class A of the Town & Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 no obstruction over 0.6 metres high shall be erected, constructed, planted or permitted to grow within the areas of the visibility splays.

Reason: To ensure vehicles exiting the drive would have sufficient visibility to enter the public highway safely, and vehicles on the public highway would have sufficient warning of a vehicle emerging to take avoiding action.

8. ACTION REQUIRED PRIOR TO FIRST USE: HIGHWAYS - PARKING AND MANOEUVRING

The use shall not commence until the area(s) within the site shown on Drawing No. 5161-0110 P04 for the purposes of manoeuvring and parking of vehicles has been provided and thereafter that area(s) shall be retained and used for no other purposes.

Reason: To ensure that sufficient space for the on-site parking of vehicles is provided and maintained in order to ensure the provision of adequate on-site space for the parking and manoeuvring of vehicles where on-street parking and manoeuvring would be detrimental to highway safety to users of the highway.

9. ACTION REQUIRED PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT: HIGHWAYS - CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

A construction management strategy is to be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority prior to work commencing on site to indicate how the construction traffic, deliveries and parking for labour is to be managed. The approved strategy is to be adhered to until completion of the development.

Reason: In the interest of highway safety to avoid the hazard caused by parking and loading on the highway and to ensure minimal adverse impact on the public highway during the construction phase.

10. ON GOING REQUIREMENT OF DEVELOPMENT: RESTRICTION ON CONSTRUCTION TIMES

The development hereby permitted shall only be constructed between the hours of 08:00 and 18:00 Mondays to Fridays and between the hours of 08:00 and 14:00 on Saturday. There shall be no working on Sundays and Bank Holidays. There shall be no deliveries to the development/use arranged for outside of these hours.

Reason - To enable the Local Planning Authority to retain control over the development in the interests of residential amenity within close proximity.

11. SPECIFIC RESTRICTION ON DEVELOPMENT: OCCUPATION RESTRICTION

This permission shall only authorise the use and occupation of The Stables for purposes of letting rooms associated with The Angel Inn and does not permit the use of the accommodation as a separate household.

Reason - The Stables has lost its private amenity space, and its proximity to the terrace would be unsuitable for residents of a separate unit of accommodation because of loss of residential amenity, particularly in regards to noise.

Please read carefully

This decision notice refers only to the decision made by the Local Planning Authority under the Town and Country Planning Acts and DOES NOT include any other consent or approval required under enactment, bylaw, order or regulation.

Please note: depending upon what conditions have been attached to the decision, action may be required on your part before you can begin your development. Planning conditions usually require that you write to the Local Planning Authority and obtain confirmation that you have discharged your obligations. Notice of appeal in the case of applications for advertisement consent must be served within eight weeks of receipt of this notice. Notice of Householder and Minor Commercial Appeals must be served within 12 weeks, in all other cases, notice of appeal must be served within six months of this notice. If this is a decision on a planning application relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as is already the subject of an enforcement notice, if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within 28 days of the date of this notice. If an enforcement notice is served relating to the same or substantially the same land and development as in your application and if you want to appeal against your local planning authority's decision on your application, then you must do so within: 28 days of the date of service of the enforcement notice, or within six months of the date of this notice, whichever period expires earlier.

The Secretary of State is not required to entertain an appeal if it appears to him/her that permission for the proposed development could not have been granted by the Local Planning Authority, or could not have been so granted otherwise than subject to the conditions imposed by it, having regard to the statutory requirements*, to the provisions of the Development Order, and to any directions given under the Order. The Secretary of State does not in practise refuse to entertain appeals solely because the decision of the Local Planning Authority was based on a direction given by him/her.

2. If permission or consent to develop land or carry out works is refused or granted subject to conditions, whether by the Local Planning Authority or by the Secretary of State and the owner of the land claims that the land has become incapable of reasonable beneficial use by the carrying out of any development or works which has been or would be permitted they may serve on the Council of the district in which the land is situated, a purchase notice requiring the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Section 137 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 or Section 32 Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
