There are two sets of three fir trees which are an overgrown hedge and are blocking light. The other tree which is also a fir tree is dead/dying and is in danger of either falling into the carpark, or falling into a neighbours garden. Whichever way it would cause a lot of damage if not taken down. One of the sets of trees are causing shade to bedrooms in the hotel and would not be replaced. The other set has been planted along the wall of a 'walled garden' which would have once accommodated fruit trees. It is the intention to re-instate the garden in it's original form. The third single tree which is unsafe grows on a bank with trees on either side of it, so would not be replaced.
