Robinia pseudoacacia in back garden at 50 Blackheath Park. The main trunk has split over the past months and there is a large branch about 3 metres off the ground which is apparently causing this and may fall (see photos - particularly 8728). We consulted Mr Russ Busch, a tree surgeon, who visited on 10th April and has advised that this branch should be removed. He feels that once this is done, he will be able to assess whether further work needs to be done on the main trunk in order to conserve the younger vertical shoots.

We are seeking permission to remove the potentially dangerous branch and to do any further work as advised by Mr Busch, the tree surgeon, to ensure the tree's conservation and safety.
