Comment Reasons:

Comment: The over development of this site would be detrimental to the local area, currently the local area consists of a smallish development of houses, some ancient woodland and only one suitable road into the area.

If the population of the area increases to incorporate in excess of 600 dwellings, the roads and local services would be incapacitated as they barely cope with the present population now, local residents have had numerous occasions of being without drinking water for several weeks, and having to use bottled water. Would the local sewers cope?

Numerous wildlife can be seen in the local wooded area, with more people encroaching on their habitat, this would also be a disaster.

Local roads are not substantial enough to cope with a huge increase of use, plus the additional noise and pollution created by a large increase in vehicles, as local buses and trains do not serve this area. Crow Drive is not suitable for a prolonged influx of heavy construction vehicles. Local flooding of roads, can cause traffic to detour through other local villages, again causing traffic problems.

In summery, over development of this area would be completely detrimental to the existing local population and wildlife.
