1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 The application

This document supports an application to Stirling Council by Intelligent Land Investments Group plc for consent under the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 for construction of a battery energy storage system at Bolfornought Farm, by Springkerse, Stirling FK7 7LL. The proposal is described as Bolfornought Energy Storage.

The application seeks consent for the installation of an energy storage system with a generating capacity of up to 49.99 megawatts. The development would consist of containers containing batteries and associated equipment, an access track, electricity meter building, fencing and new planting. Figures show the site location, and layout.

1.2 Site description

The proposed development site lies in farmland, part of Bolfornought Farm, a working farm. The site is agricultural land. The field in which the proposed development is sited is accessed from the A91 Distributor Road at the Muirton roundabout from where the existing private access serves the farm and 6 houses. This is in the vicinity of Forthbank Stadium and St Modans High School.

The site lies on the flat carse farmland around 2 kilometres east of the town of Stirling on the edge of the large Springkerse industrial area.

The site is around 300 metres from the nearest house at Upper Taylorton Farm to the north.

2 LEGISLATION AND GUIDANCE

Intelligent Land Investments Group plc is applying to Stirling Council for consent under the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 as amended, for a grid-connected battery energy storage system at Bolfornought Farm, Springkerse, east of Stirling. The applicant wishes to install a generation capacity of over 20 megawatts, the relevant threshold, and so the applicant must carry out pre-application consultation, and submit a report on this activity. This document reports the consultation process and results.

A Proposal of Application Notice proforma was completed dated 13th August 2020 and submitted to Stirling Council with the location and site plans and registered 14th August (planning reference PAN-2020-009). A reply was received from the Council dated 20th August 2020 accepting the level of information submitted and the level of consultation proposed.

The Town and Country Planning (Miscellaneous Temporary Modifications) (Coronavirus) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 which came into effect on 24 April 2020, temporarily suspend the requirement to hold a public event for a proposal such as Bolfornought Energy Storage and describe alternative arrangements.

The applicant had intended to hold a public event in a local venue and altered this approach in the light of the Coronavirus situation.

3 COMMITMENT TO ENGAGEMENT

The developer, Intelligent Land Investments Group plc, is committed to consultation and engagement with communities. A large number of consultation events have been held for projects and the company is readily accessible through its website and social media.

4 CONSULTATION

4.1 Proposal of Application Notice

A Proposal of Application Notice was submitted to the Council and registered in August 2020. An online event was proposed to describe and introduce the project and answer any questions.

The applicant made contact with Polmaise Community Council and with Braehead and Broomridge Community Council at that time.

An advertisement was placed in the Stirling Observer of 9th September 2020 advertising the project, describing how to access the online event and obtain information about the project online, and how to ask questions or give feedback to the developer. A copy of this advert is provided in Appendix 1 of this report.

4.2 Webinar

A Webinar Event was held live on the 22nd September 2020 from 3pm to 7pm.

A video presentation was made by 2 staff from the developer. Maps and plans were included with information about battery storage technology and the applicant. The purpose of the event was to explain the battery storage project, engage with those present, answer questions and to seek feedback.

Questions or comments were invited either by typing into the 'chat' box next to the video presentation on screen, or by email or telephone.

The presentation was given regularly during the event as participants joined and left, and could be viewed online at any time in the following weeks.

Ten users joined the webinar. It is possible that some of these may have been more than one person viewing a computer.

No comments or feedback were received in relation to the siting or design of the facility, no written feedback was received. After the event, the applicant heard from a nearby resident seeking more information about the project and some material was provided and discussions had and we understand that party is content with the development.

4.3 Website

Information describing the Bolfornought project was available through the developer's website:

The information included a video presentation by 2 staff from ILI Group that included an introduction, a description of the location, location and site plans, and other proposed plans. It was described how to ask guestions or make comments.

In addition the site included a downloadable presentation that included a description of the project and its purpose, information about the applicant, the choice of location, as well as proposed site plans and sections.

These websites were still available as at mid February 2021, more than 20 weeks after the event.

4.4 Other feedback

The developer received no other feedback about this project by other means or at other times.

5 CONCLUSIONS

The developer proposes a battery energy storage facility at Bolfornought east of Stirling. The developer has undertaken consultations and engagement in relation to this proposal. This has included contacting community councils, newspaper advertisement, and a public event.

No significant issues have been raised by members of the public or other consultees.
