I am in the process of selling my house, the solicitors requested a copy of the TPO from Tameside Council and forwarded myself a copy. I was unaware of any TPOs on my land. The paperwork received from my solicitor is the first time I had seen any document like this. On inspection of the TPO Order I have realised the 2 trees mentioned above have been felled. From memory this was about 5 years ago. I called Tameside Council today on 0161 342 8355 and they instructed me to fill out this planning application.
