Good morning Steve

I've received an enquiry regarding an alleged dangerous tree overhanging the public footpath at Eyre Chapel. The enquiry claims the tree has Ash dieback and needs to be felled. Allegedly, Three different tree surgeons have confirmed this.

I've inspected the tree and can see no signs of Ash dieback. The tree was displaying a healthy canopy at the time of inspection with only minor dead wood over the footway. The attached photo shows the tree with a healthy canopy. I'm not sure if this is T3 or T4 on the TPO plan.


The only work I will be recommending to this tree is the removal of the dead branches that overhangs the public footpath.

Would this email be acceptable notification for the removal of the dead branches only? I will inform the landowner that you have been made aware and that they can proceed with the removal of the dead branches.
