



## SUPPORTING STATEMENT

*The Sun Room proposed for the side elevation at the Jamestown Manse is to replace a lean-to glazed timber conservatory that was attached to the Manse for many years until its removal in the 1980's. Unfortunately, the current owners do not have further details of the old conservatory other than a rather fuzzy aerial photograph, which shows it. There was a door connection from the main building into the conservatory at that time, which was formed into a window when the conservatory was removed.*

*The current owners wish to reinstate the conservatory with a Sun Room, made of timber over a solid base below window cill level, with fully glazed walls and a slate roof. The slate roof would make the space more usable for most of the year. The sun room is to allow the current [REDACTED] owner to use his current Study as a ground floor Bedroom and allow the new sun room to be used as an ad-hoc study. The original doorway into the sun room would be reinstated.*
