Thank you for your application.

Due to the Beech trees being within the Conservation Area but not covered by a TPO, a separate TCA application will be set up for these trees.

Furthermore, please could you clarify whether you wish to fell, crown reduce, crown lift or crown thin the Beech trees and Sycamore tree as this has not been stated on the application form. If you wish to reduce the crown or lift the crown, please could you provide an approximate measurement in feet or metres as to the amount you wish to reduce or lift the crowns by. If you wish to thin the crowns, please could you provide the amount as a percentage.

On the application form, you have ticked 'Yes' to section 4.1. Due to the Sycamore tree being covered by a TPO, the following must be provided as required by the application form:

"Condition of the trees(s) - e.g. it is diseased or you have fears that it might break or fall.

If Yes, you are required to provide written arboricultural advice or other diagnostic information from an appropriate expert".

Please could you provide the above information via email at your earliest convenience as I am unable to proceed with the validation of your application without it.

If possible, please could you provide photographs of the Beech and Sycamore trees in question as this would be most helpful to the case officer when assessing the proposed works.
