# 5. Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Beeches [T1 and T2] have grown from hedging size to tall trees immediately next to neighbour's garage with boughs overhanging and also dropping mast onto garage roof. Concern that roots will damage garage base and that a bough may fall off onto garage. The trees are of sufficient size that wind could topple them onto one of two different neighbours' houses. Not subject to TPO. These two trees are my priority

Sycamore [T3[ is subject to TPO but is large and growing, and potentially a problem if fell onto either of two neighbours' houses.

I have already planted Alder, Rowan and Oak in safer parts of the property and have a disease resistant elm [sapporo gold] growing to encourage colonisation by white-letter hairstreak which occurs nearby. This is being shaded by the Sycamore. The oaks have already attracted Merveille de jour moth. I have more oak and alder buckthorn to plant away from the neighbours. I intend pollarding the oaks
