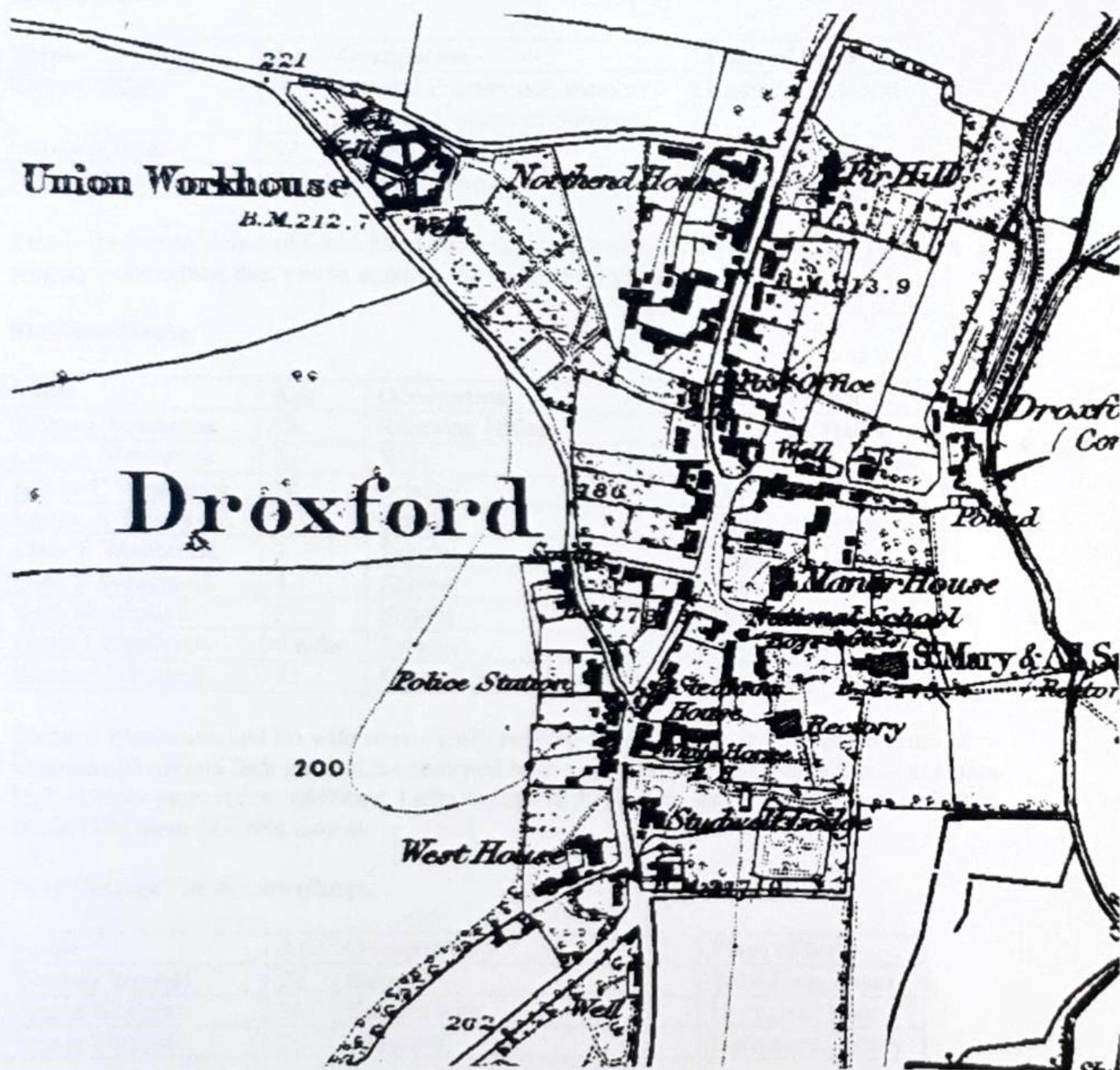


APPENDIX X Map of Droxford showing Droxford Union (top left) circa 1872



It is worth noting that Stedham House is one of only 14 houses/buildings identified on the map. The scale, and prison like structure, of the Droxford Union Workhouse (top left) – where Richard Westbrook was Relieving Officer – is surprising.

Census carried out in 1881 (Hampshire Record Office, Winchester)

This is the first evidence of Greta House as a separate entity and also its use as a Doctor's surgery – something that was to continue for another 90 years.

Richard Westbrook and his wife were clearly creating a large family, even in those times of communal beds and bedrooms, this could well have required more space than Stedham House had – before more recent additions. Little wonder he hung onto the 'Northernmost' bedroom in his 1884 lease of Greta House.

What is unclear is how much either profession was carried out on the premises. The itinerant nature of the Wraights (for the time) is also interesting.

Frederick Martin Godde-Smith had taken over from the Blighs in 1884, but just seven years later it appears that a young Irish doctor had taken over the practice. There is not yet any evidence for how long he and his family stayed – though we know Edgar Courtney Pern took over in 1913 (but that's a 22 year gap). It would seem that the Goodwyn family brought their groom and parlour maid with them from Devon.

Richard Westbrook and his family have moved out and are now letting the house. A Thomas Balguy was an Archdeacon of Winchester in the late 1700s. So the family may have had local roots.

Edwin Baker is carrying out the same work – plumber – as William Reeve before him.

Both these last two entries are noted as having less than 5 rooms occupied – the census states that only 4 rooms in each house were actually occupied.

APPENDIX XIII Map showing houses and property boundaries in 1913 conveyance.



The lines on this map suggest that the South-west corner of Greta House was at some stage separately owned, and that Ivy Cottage (as it is now) is an extension of the two earlier cottages.
