

The Nook has exposed beams and joists below Jetty, C20 door and 3 C20 Casement windows on each floor, gabled roof.

The Nook has Jowled Posts, Close Studding exposed internally, edge-halved and bridled Scarf in NE wallplate, grooves for sliding shutters and mortices for diamond mullions. Faintly carved date ~~1602~~ 1602 on mantel beam of inserted chimney stack, brickwork below renewed. Exposed Plain Joists of horizontal section.

The S.E. side only of the second transverse beam from NW end has rich fold leaf carving. There is an inserted ceiling above first floor, the beam plain-chamfered with lambs tongue stops, early C17.

Removing the boiler room added in 1971 will not effect any of the building as it is built against it and not toothed in to brickwork.
