Site: Land on Cartridge Place Between Buildings 17 and 19, Woolwich, London SE18 6FR

Applicant: Andrea Salazar Punchdrunk

Proposal: Construction of a single storey building on Cartridge Place for a temporary period, providing internal circulation, front of house, box office and supporting functions, ancillary to the use of Buildings 17 and 19, and the relocation of motorcycle bays from Cartridge Place to the car parking area to the north of Building 19.

I acknowledge receipt of your application in respect of the above which was received as valid on 14 September 2021. I may have changed your description of the proposal to make it more clear, but if you are not satisfied please let me know.

I have until 09 November 2021 to deal with your application. If you have not been notified of any decision by then you can appeal to the Secretary of State for the Environment under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended). You should appeal within six months and you must use a form which you can get from the Planning Inspectorate at Chartroom, The Planning Inspectorate, Eagle Wing, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN. This does not apply if your application has already been referred to the Secretary of State for the Environment.

What we do with your information

We use the information provided to us to make decisions about the use of land in the public interest. Some information provided to us we are obliged under the regulations

to make available on planning registers. This is a permanent record of our planning decisions that form part of the planning history of a site.

How we share your information

We will make details of planning applications available online so that people can contribute their comments. We will sometimes need to share the information we have with other parts of the council - for example to establish how long a building has been used.
