e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Beech Tree - it suffers from Meripulus Giganteus. We reduced the height of the tree by between 20 and 30 ft 5 years ago. Since then the tree has suffered further die back and needs further reduction in order to ensure that it does not hit the house if it falls. The state of the tree was initially identified by Hugh Coggles from SNDC 5 years ago and permission was given for reduction or felling.

Given the extensive decay and necessity for ongoing management, in regards to proximity to the house and the trees own ecological value, staged veteran management could well be a viable option. The same tree surgeon who I used before plans to do the following work;

He intends to reduce the large upright limbs, reducing the tree as a whole to well below the height that concerns hitting the house. This approach would also likely (hopefully) dramatically increase the life expectancy of the tree - by removing much weight and 'sail' attributed to root failure in high winds, especially given the ongoing decay present within the root system.
