## Exceptions for when Full Species, Habitat or Geodiversity Surveys and Assessments may not be required:

Following consultation by the applicant at the pre-application stage, when the Local Planning Authority (LPA) has stated in writing that no protected species surveys or assessments are required.

If it is clear that **no protected species** / **or important habitats** are likely to be present or affected by the development, despite the guidance in the above tables. The applicant may need to provide evidence with the planning application to demonstrate that either:

- 1. such species are absent (e.g. this might be in the form of a letter or brief report from a suitably qualified and experienced person, or a relevant local nature conservation organisation); or
- 2. that the development proposal will not affect any protected species present.

This information should include a statement acknowledging that the applicant is aware that it is a criminal offence to disturb or harm protected species should they subsequently be found or disturbed.

It is only appropriate for surveys to be undertaken of those species which are likely to be present and affected by a proposal. However opportunities for encouraging some other species may be provided within the report.
