Yews 1 and 2 - having just moved into the house and area we are seeking a reduction in height so as to maintain a safe clearance of 1.5m from the o/h lines, and approximately 20% reduction in the radial spread of the trees to reduce excessive shading to front of house / overhand onto the private road and also to bring trees back into proportion with their height following what appears to have been many previous years of crude height reductions. Being Yew, we are advised that they should respond adequately to such a level of reduction. We have been advised by our tree surgeon that he will not use a chainsaw in the reductions proposed and that hand tools will be used instead.
