PLANTING SCHEDULE

All planting to take place in spring or autumn.

Tree Schedule

Ref no.	Plant name	Size	Girth		Mature height	Maintenance/planting
1	Sorbus aucuparia	3.5m high	12cm		Height 15m	Incorporate lots of well rotted garden compost in the planting hole and stake firmly. Prune in autumn. Remove any damaged, diseased or broken branches.
2	Betula pendula	4m high	12cm		Height 30m	Mulch for a three foot radius around young trees. Mulch layer to be two inches deep. Do not mulch next to the trunk.
3	Prunus 'Kiku-shidare-zakura'	1.5m high	75mm		Height 3m	Prune upward facing buds to maintain the weeping habit

Tree planting - Loosen soil generally to eliminate compaction and improve drainage when planting. Spread the roots around the hole. Refill the hole with an addition of compost mixed with the soil when planting on heavy clay. Eliminate air pockets and firm the soil around the roots. Water well to settle the soil around the trees to eliminate any remaining air pockets. Stake trees at 45 degrees and secure tree to stake with flexible tree ties.

General tree care - Control weed growth around the base of the tree. During the first summer water the trees during dry spells. Top dress annually in spring with general purpose fertiliser and re-apply mulch for the first two years. Check the tree tie and loosen when necessary. Remove the tree stake after three years.

1	Lonicera ligustrina var. pileata	2 litre		Height 1.0m Width 2.0m	Apply a generous amount of well-rotted garden compost or manure around the base of the plant in late spring.

Planting to be carried out in spring or autumn. John Innes number 3 compost. Plants should be fertilized regularly to ensure continuous growth.

Planting Schedule

1	Euonymus fortunei 'Emerald Gaiety'	1.5 litre		Height 1.0m Width 1.5m	Tip prune young plants in mid to late spring to encourage bushy growth. Apply a generous mulch of well rotted garden compost manure around the base.
2	Geranium 'Johnsons Blue'	9 cm		Height 300mm Width 600mm	In mid summer rejuvenate plants by removing old flowered stems and leaves. Lift and divide large colonies in spring.

3	Hebe 'Red Edge'	1.5 litre		Height 450mm Width 600mm	Needs minimal pruning. Remove misplaced or frost damaged branches in late spring.
4	Hylotelephium 'Herbstfreude'	1.5 litre		Height 600mm Width 600mm	In February and March cut back the flower heads and apply a generous mulch of well rotted garden compost or manure around the base.
5	Hypericum x hidcoteense 'Hidcote'	1.5 litre		Height 1.2m Width 1.5m	After flowering lightly trim shoots that spoil the symmetry of the plant. After pruning apply a generous mulch of well rotted garden compost or manure.
6	Lavandula angustifolia 'Hidcote'	1.5 litre		Height 600mm Width 750mm	Cut back the stalks after the flowers have faded. Carefully trim back in April taking care not to cut into old wood.
7	Pittisporum 'Tom Thumb'	1.5 litre		Height 1m Width 600mm	Minimal pruning required. To thin or reduce growth, prune mid spring and apply a generous mulch of well-rotted garden compost or manure around the base of the plant.

When planting, ensure plants have been well soaked in water prior to planting. Plants to be planted in a good quality multi purpose, John Innes number 3 compost. Plants should be fertilized regularly to ensure continuous growth.
