Inspection of a four holly trees: The Old House, Lodsworth, West Sussex By: James Bloor (NPTC Qualified Arborist) Inspected on October 6th 2021

The group of holly trees are negatively affecting two other trees (one deodar cedar and one robinia psuedoacacia) close by.

My recommendation is to remove 3 of the 4 multi stemmed holly trees.

By carrying out the recommended work above this will allow the Robinia Psuedoacacia and Deodar Cedar (page 2)and the fourth holly to flourish.



My client has informed me that a lot of tree planting has been done recently on site. Most are ornamental trees but there are also a few holm oak's that are native. They have also recently planted 80 metres of Hornbeam hedging - also native. And would, if it helps, be keen to see a TPO being put onto the ancient Sweet Chestnut Tree which is in the grounds of the property behind their house. (see pictures on page 3)
