Hello,

I'm not sure what the process is but I'm seeking permission to remove and trim some trees at our property that we have recently purchased.

I believe that some intervention is required in several areas to protect other existing trees, property and the public. I will try to summarise the request in the following and have attached an image titled 'tree plan' that I have numbered to correspond to the numbered items below, along with the additional images of the trees in question.

- 1. Permission was granted after request by the previous owners in 2020 to remove this dead tree (reference attached), but the work was not carried out. Please could you confirm that this is still valid following the change of ownership?
- 2. This tree is immediately adjacent to the tree identified by (1), appears to be in poor condition, is fighting for space with the Copper Beech tree on the other side, and, is interfering with our telecommunications connection. Please confirm that this can also be removed.
- 3. Tree 3 is in poor condition (rotten) and has actually split, with a significant branch currently hanging in a suspended state over our garden shed. To the untrained eye it appears that the smaller trees in this area are being starved of light and water by tree 4, a very large beech tree. Please confirm that tree 3 can be removed.
- 4. Tree 4 is a very large Beech tree. There are many low hanging branches that are being starved of light and are beginning to grown downwards, impacting on our useable garden space. There is significant fallout from these lower, smaller branches as they appear to be dying off before they are properly established. I would like to request permission for a 'crown lifting' or other works recommended by a competent arborist to maintain the long-term health of this tree. Please confirm that this is acceptable.
