After having the trees on my land examined by a competent arboriculturist it has become apparent that most if not all of the ash trees are showing signs of ash die back disease. Several trees which are adjacent/overhanging the highway now cause a risk of serious harm.

I wish to give notice of works to these trees and also an adjacent cherry tree that is showing extensive signs of decay.

I attach a plan showing the position of the trees.

The trees are all approx 40ft high and would need to be removed to a stump as being on sloping land they would continue to cause a threat to safety if topped or lopped.
