e.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with one standard ash in same position.

Location T1 - Job 1 Beech (I). Tree is dead. In danger of falling. Very bad decay and attacked by fungus. Permission to fell. URGENT
Location T3 - Job 2 Oak (K) - Increasingly leaning. Overlooking next door's conservatory. Concerned it will fall. Ground around roots is spongy. Permission to fell.
Location T4 - Job 3 Ash (G) - Dying back and some disease. Permission to fell.
Location G1 - Job 4 Oak (E) - Major prune needed to previous pruning points and remove dead branches. No reduction in the height (crown). 5% to 10% thinning.
Location G1 - Job 5 Oak (A) - Major prune to remove deadwood that's already falling and making garden dangerous. No reduction in the height (crown). 5% to 10% thinning. Work URGENT as large branches are already falling off.
Location T2 - Job 6 Ash (G) - Tree is dead (no leaves at all this year) and overlooking pub garden so in danger of falling. Permission to fell.
Location G1 - Job 7 Sycamore (B) - Large tree is centre of the garden. Major dead wooding needed. Large branches already falling. No reduction in the height (crown). 5% to 10% thinning.

The trees are in heavily wooded areas. The tree surgeon has advised that, in 3 of the 4 felling cases, removing these trees will improve the health of neighbouring trees and may stop others dying as there will be more light. We are looking at re-planting only at T2 and are looking at either a beech or oak plus the continuing of the hedge.
