Morning Nigel

I have had a look at the hornbeam and I believe the fungi to the base are a Boletas species which are not root decayers.

There is a large broken hanging branch overhanging the road/footpath which needs to be removed asap. I suspect the broken branch is a result of squirrel damage and suggest an overall crown reduction of 10-20% to reduce wind stress on any damaged branches. Also if your tree surgeon identifies any particularly damaged areas on substantial branches err toward the 20% + mark.
