Cottage. C18 altered C19. Brick, thatch roof. 1½ storey, 2 bay with outshot hip bays each end, wing to rear to one side of centre. Front has central plank door under tiled, gabled hood on posts. Each side 3-light casement under segmental head and 2-light similar in end bays. Above, either side of centre 2-light eyebrow dormer. Roof hipped and swept-down either end. Central ridge stack.

<u>Detail</u>

Popes Cottage is a Grade II listed house located in Bramshaw, within the New Forest National Park. The original part of the cottage was built in the 18th Century and it was later altered in the 19th century. It is built predominantly of brick for the external walls and finished with a thatched roof on the original cottage and clay tiles on the later addition to the rear, this was changed from thatch in 2016.

The cottage is built using timber framed casement windows finished in cream and has 2 brick chimneys. It sits back from the main road, B3079. Houses along the road are all detached with reasonable sized plots.
