




Figure A2: Old Arngrove Farm, Ground Floor and exterior Photo Plan (North)

The foundations of Old Arngrove Farmhouse were revealed to be made of roughly-hewn blocks of stone in a sandy mortar with tile spacers. The foundations were 0.4m deep (B4).


