**W/21/2124 LB**

**Description:** Enlarge door opening on first floor to enable an accessibility scooter to access all areas of the museum. Change the configuration of the ground floor toilets by providing a new opening to the male toilets. To also provide an individual accessible toilet with separate access.

Pageant House is a Grade II Listed Building (307525) located in the Warwick Conservation Area. This Georgian building was part of the rebuilding of Warwick after the Great Fire of 1694. Acquired by Warwick Town Council and subsequently passed into the ownership of Warwick District Council. The building is now used as offices for Warwick Town Council including the Mayors Parlour, Live and Local which supports a network of voluntary organisations who bring their communities together to enjoy high-quality, entertaining and affordable

professional live theatre, storytelling, music, dance, family & children's shows and film screenings in their local village hall, church or school and Warwickshire County Council, who perform marriage ceremonies in the building, and their associated offices. In 2022 The Royal Regiment of the Warwickshire Fusiliers, will also be moving their museum to the first floor of the building.

Pre- application advice has been sought from Robert Dawson, Principal Conservation Officer at Warwick District Council. Previous applications submitted on behalf of the Fusiliers for associated internal work have been approved.


The scope of works has no significant impact on the heritage asset and setting, and no loss of historic building fabric.

The creation of the new male toilet door would include architraves and moulding to match the existing period features of adjacent door surrounds. It is unlikely that the toilet partitioning would be considered to be part of the original fabric.

2. Early C19, 3 storey 6 window stucco facade. Tonic pilasters at extremities of first and second floors with entablature and parapet. Ground floor has horizontal rustications with panelled projections at extremities under pilasters. Slightly projecting entrance bay (off centre) has porch with Greek Ionic columns and entablature, 5-panel door and rectangular fanlight. Sashes have moulded architraves with the addition of pulvinated frieze and cornice to those on first floor. Three sash windows to left hand side of porch are probably facsimile additions.

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## Castle Lane / High Street /Jury Street



- Small scale mid late 19th Century terraces.

- Medieval and earlier origins as part of Ethelfleda's bugh; High Street/Jury Street forms the north/south spine through and from Warwick.

- Mainly residential, but some retail/commercial along High Street and Jury Street.

- Mostly rebuilt after the fire of Warwick. Pageant Gardens provides a small amount of public open space. Properties fronting Castle Lane tend generally to be more recent infill.

- Varying plot widths; those fronting High Street and Jury Street are generally narrow and long.

- Varying building height; generally two/three storey to the east, Eastgate Mews has higher three and four storey additions, as has the new infill to the rear of 22-26 Jury Street.

- Oakens House, No. 20 Castle Street , No. 1 Jury Street (The Courthouse) and No. 1 High Street (The Aylesford) are Listed Grade II\*, Grade I and Grade II\* respectively, and are key buildings in the area.

- Medieval, Georgian, Victorian and Modern architectural styles.

- Timber frame, stone, brick, render, tile and slate.

- Some 49 Listed Buildings.

- No Scheduled Ancient Monuments.

- Generally a hard urban landscape with Castle Park and Pageant Gardens providing a prominent walled edge with treed greenery over.

- Good to high visual quality.
