

# **Bird Boxes**

Rectory Farm Buildings, Lower Benefield



### 1. Nest Boxes which can be installed on trees

#### **1N Deep Nest Box**

Provides nesting opportunities for birds which prefer to nest deep into recesses. The box has a double compartment for nesting away from predators and two holes to let in plenty of light. Robins are particularly attracted to this type of box, especially if it is placed approx. 1.0 to 1.5 m above the ground, preferably in a moist, shady area





#### 2H Open Fronted

An open nest box allows more light in attracting birds such as the robin, wren and pied wagtail. It is designed to be hung so that the entrance is to one side (at an angle of 90° to the wall). The front panel can be easily removed for cleaning








#### 1B General Purpose Nest Box

Provides nesting for a wide variety of birds including great, blue and coal tits, nuthatch and house sparrow. The box is designed to give added protection to its occupants from cats, magpies and jays. It is usually attached to a tree using the Schwegler Aluminum Nail. It can also be hung from a branch.
