

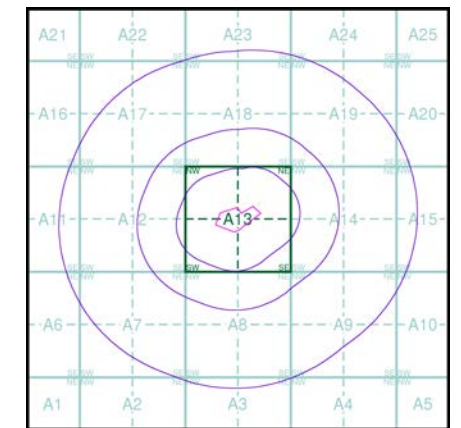

OS Water Network Map - Slice A

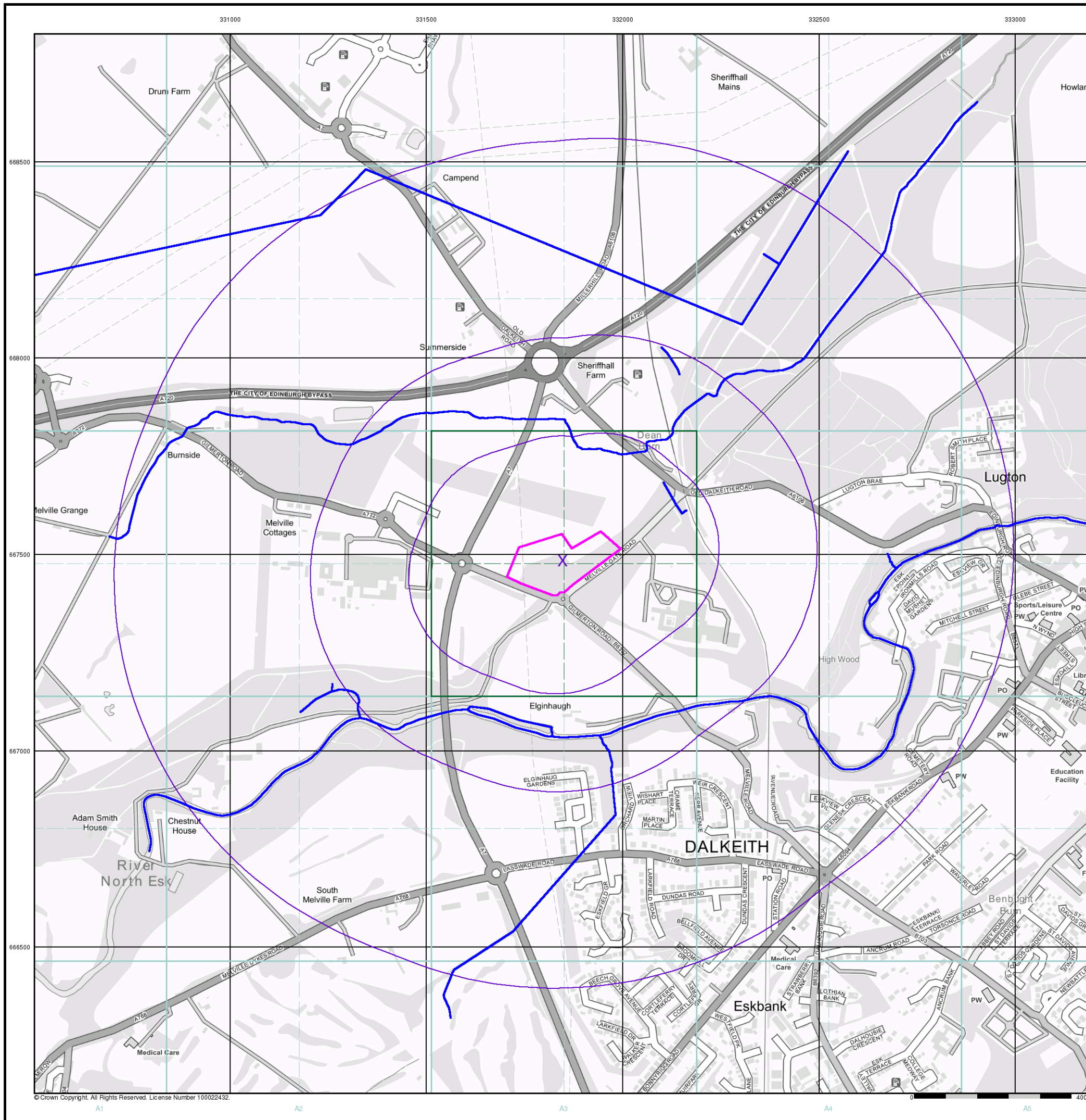

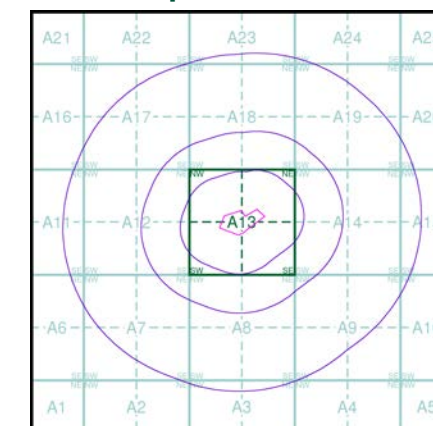

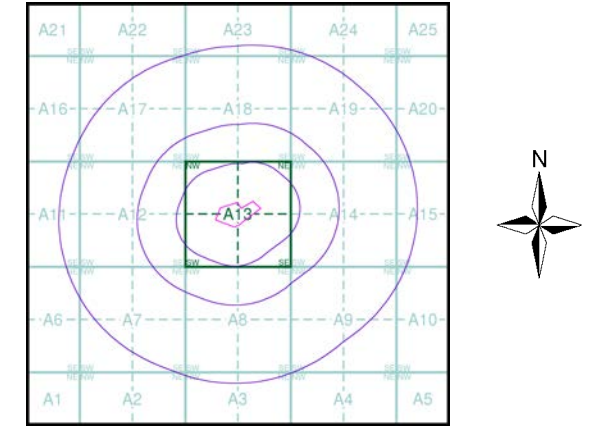
