This proposal is to install 14 photovoltaic solar panels to the garage building at Mill Farm House.

The main house of Mill Farm House is a Grade II listed building; due to this the installation of these panels requires Planning Permission and Listed Building consent.

This panels will be situated on the west and east facing roof of the double garage building that is within the curtilage of Mill Farm House. The garage is of recent construction and was granted approval in 1999 under reference BDB/45688.

The panels will be fixed affixed using metal fixing brackets and will project no more than 150mm from the slope of the roof.

The panels are largely hidden from the surrounding area either by the main house, or an extensive hedgerow on the western boundary. The rear of the garage overlooks a very large field.
