The work is only on the garden path, which is separate from the house. No part of the house itself will be affected. The path consists mainly of Kentish ragstone, with two small sections of brick, in both cases bedded on soil. The proposed work is:

Excavate current pathway, but keeping current Kentish ragstone and brick.

Disposing of any spoil.

Dig to a depth of 200-250mm (8-10inches).

Put in a sub base of type 1, around 3 inches and compact down using a compactor plate.

Bed the recycled Kentish ragstone and brick on a full bed of concrete for the depth and to be laid level, so easy to walk on.

A sand and cement mortar mix for the pointing using bird-beak technique to tie everything together, to strengthen and flatten the pathway without altering its character.

7. Grounds for Application

Please state why you consider that a Certificate of Lawfulness of Proposed Works should be granted for these works i.e. why they do not require listed building consent and will not affect the character of the listed building as a building of special architectural or historic interest:

The garden path is not part of the building itself, which would not be affected in any way. The path is not of special architectural or historic interest. It is a utility which does not fulfil its purpose. It is comprised primarily of stones resting on earth. The surface has become uneven leading to people (of different ages) slipping over, resulting in one case in hospitalisation. The current owner is unable to walk on them without someone to offer her physical support. They are an actual liability. The works will entail the relaying of the existing stones so as to make them more even while maintaining the existing appearance. The character of neither the building nor the footpath will be affected.
