Please find attached an overview of Public Rights of Way likely to be impacted by the proposed application – Lancashire County Council – Public Rights of Way have no objections to the application but have the following to take into consideration:-

- Public Right of Way 2-23-FP10 runs alongside the proposed access track and to protect users of the footpath a 10 mph speed restriction sign should be erected at appropriate points giving priority to pedestrians
- Any landscaping either within the proposed site or close proximity should be at least 3 metres away from the footpath to ensure overhang or roots growing through the surface of the Right of Way do not create a health and safety hazard e.g. falling branches/trip hazards or future maintenance issues.
