Camera shake is exacerbated if using zoom but small lightweight tripods are available which can be rested against walls to reduce camera shake. Photographs should be numbered or labelled and related to the planning proposals. Wherever possible, please submit them electronically.

**BAT SURVEY REQUIRED\***  
 The structure and location of your proposal indicates that there is a reasonable likelihood of a bat roost which may be affected by your development proposal. A bat survey will be required before your application can be validated. This must meet the 'Minimum Standards for Bat Surveys in West Yorkshire' (<http://www.ecology.wyjs.org.uk/documents/Bat-Surveys-Approved.pdf>) and other current best practice guidance and be undertaken by a licensed bat worker. These guidelines will normally require dawn or dusk surveys to be undertaken between May and September. However, where a winter survey establishes that there is limited bat roost potential or that adverse impacts can be avoided, a dawn or dusk survey may not be required.
